I wanted to let one of the guys, Chris, tell you some of what the Lord did while they were there:

(From Chris.) During the first Thanksgiving party on one campus, I was able to walk through the gospel with a student that had never heard of Jesus before. From the moment he walked into the party, we had a special connection—he was by my side the entire night. He didn't have an English name, and I got to give him the name Noah. After I shared my testimony and the gospel with him, Noah made a decision to give his life to Jesus and enter into a relationship with him!

God is Alive and Well :-)Yours, Noah Then the following night at another Thanksgiving party another student, with the same English name as me, made a decision to follow Jesus. The next day when I met up with him he told me that after he left
