But, as I'm sure you know, God most often surprises us, and it turned out that Melanie had a really wonderful time. So wonderful, in fact, that she came back to campus with new energy and drive that has rubbed off on all the rest of our students!

Ever since I came to Dartmouth we have been dealing with the dynamic of trying to drag students toward Christ and growth opportunities. All of a sudden, as Melanie has shown excitement and taken the initiative to lead, student initiative and excitement has been popping up all over the place! They are mentoring younger students, talking with other students about their relationships with Jesus, leading our weekly meeting, and interested in missions opportunities! It has been shocking, humbling (why couldn't we make that happen??!), and wonderful to watch.
