Throughout the term we have continued to follow up surveys that we did with (mostly) freshmen during freshman orientation week. At the beginning of November, Naomi (class of 2007) and I were in one of the dorms trying to meet some of these students who had filled out our survey, and we dropped in on a sophomore named Jarrett who had filled one out.

We talked with him a little about spiritual things, and Jarrett mentioned that he had wanted to get involved with a Christian group on campus, but hadn't known how to pick one. To our surprise, his roommate, Shayan, chimed in from the other room, saying that he had been interested in learning more

about Christianity, but hadn't known how to begin.

Well, we invited them both to some of the activities we had going on, and frankly, weren't sure that we'd see either of them again. We were surprised again when Shayan showed up at our large group meeting a few days later, with a friend of his. I led a discussion time that evening on our own experience (or lack of experience) of some of the ways Jesus described a walk with God, and Shayan opened a Bible for the first time. He's Indian, from a Hindu background, and grew up in Zambia, so it's easy to see why this might be his first exposure to a book that most Americans have at least talked about before.

Shayan left that night saying that he'd had a fantastic time, and since then we've had many conversations with him about his exploration of Christianity. Shayan is genuinely seeking to know more about Jesus, and just this week asked us for a Bible. We're all praying that his encounter with Jesus through the gospels will amaze him and convince his heart that Jesus is the only way to God.
