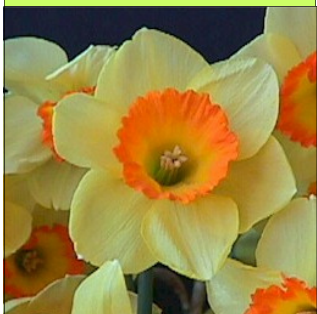

2006 so far has been the year of Dartmouth student initiative. It has been awesome! It sounds funny even to my ears to be excited about Ivy League students leading, but *apathetic* is one of the best words I could have used to describe many of our students up to this point. This year, though, it seems that God has lit a fire under the Christian students we mentor, and it has been wonderful to see them get excited about God using them.

A year ago, one of our students, who was still unsure about the whole Christianity thing, was in the Greek system. Now there are eight Christian women in her sorority, and they have had a discussion group about religion

in their house, and two of the women are leading a Bible study on women in the Old Testament. That Bible study draws not only Christians, but also some Jewish, Muslim and Agnostic women in their sorority.

Tonight (and tomorrow night) different students from our group are passing out Popsicles to students while they wait to pick their on-campus housing. We bought 2000 Popsicles.

This past Friday 11 of our students camped out all night to do the Relay For Life (supporting cancer research). They want other Dartmouth students to know that Christians care about hurting people on campus and in the

world.

Every freshman in our ministry is being met with regularly by an upperclassman who wants to encourage them in their walk with God. Sometimes the upperclassmen fight over who gets to "adopt" a given freshman!

One of the seniors in our ministry has been asking God for opportunities to talk with her friends about Jesus. She has seen one of her friends this year move from being an atheist to one who is considering the claims of Jesus.

God is up to something here! I am praying with all my heart that He'll continue to show us where He's working so we can join Him there.
