Jacob came to Dartmouth wrestling with God regarding some of the events that had happened in his life – he had a difficult family situation and his mom had passed away before he graduated from high school. He really struggled to believe that God was good or trustworthy; there was so much he didn't

understand about these painful circumstances. During his freshman year a friend challenged him with the idea that God often treats us like His kids and doesn't explain everything, even though He loves us, because there are some things that we just can't understand, like children. This seemed reasonable to the ever-logical Jacob, and considering this explanation gave him the freedom to pursue learning about God, Himself, without having answers to all of his questions. As you may recall, Jacob went with us on a spring break trip in 2010 and during that week had his life transformed by the gospel. He began to really understand God's love, not just with his head but with his heart, and discovered that sharing Jesus with others was not a dutiful obligation, but rather an act of love.
