A Year Later

A year ago this past weekend, we were boarding a Lear Jet with a team of doctors from Orlando, ready to head down to Haiti. It was only 72 hours after the devastating earthquake that rocked the island nation on January 12th, 2010. We were overwhelmed with what we might see, with the devastation, pain and immense needs that we would encounter. Only five minutes into our flight, one of the doctors on board, a Haitian that lives and works in the US, screamed in horror. She'd just received a text that her sister in Haiti had lost both her hands. The reality of what was waiting for us when we landed had just slapped us in the face.

We were so grateful to arrive and find Pastor Wiljean Compere, his family and the ministry of Open Door safe and unharmed by the earthquake. We spent our days together praying and planning. What would be Open Door's response to the devastation? We knew that many from Port Au Prince would be arriving soon, looking for shelter and care with family and friends in Cap Haitien. In the months after the earthquake, the population of Cap Haitien would nearly double.

Within weeks, our clinic would be turned into a stage 2 trauma center.

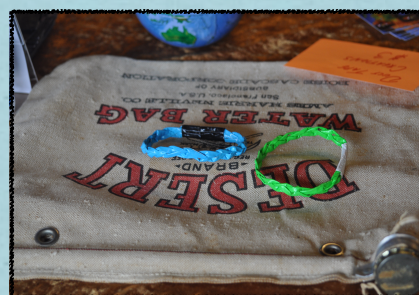
WE LOVE TIMBER LEE CAMP

Visiting doctors and nurses would stay at our ministry house, work at the clinic, or be transported to one of the area's two main hospitals. Churches, schools and civic organizations hosted food packing events, enabling us to send one million meals to Haiti. Our ministry partnered with other local churches in Cap Haitien to take responsibility for preparing food and feeding everyone at the area's two hospitals for six weeks after the earthquake. We sent medicine, supplies, blankets and other donated items on the many containers of relief support for the disaster.



As we prayed and planned, we determined that our vision for an orphanage could no longer wait. The orphan crisis in Haiti would grow substantially, and we needed to be prepared to respond. We began raising funds, and in June, construction on Open Door Children's Home began. Construction has been slowed at times by hurricanes, cholera, election chaos and other unforeseen roadblocks, but we hope to have Phase One of the project done this spring. Teams are currently putting the roof on the building.

Agriculture projects are being implemented to help with the sustainability of the ministry. A ranch for cows, a farm for goats, and land for growing crops all will help to meet the ongoing needs. Teams have irrigated fields, which will allow us to grow cash crops that will help to expand the ministry as well.

And while we have done all this to respond to the needs that surfaced after the earthquake, the ongoing work of our ministry has continued. SOYM students, trained for ministry, have had a great impact by expanding Open Door's leadership base. We now have over 500 students enrolled in Open Door School, with 350 in Bois De Lance and another 200 in Hinche, our newest work. Open Door Church in Hinche has been working to complete its building project, and we hope to have teams pour the concrete floor and build benches for Hinche in 2011. In Cap Haitien, the church just purchased a building next to their current location, and on their first Sunday, both buildings were packed and overflowing for every service.

OPPORTUNITIES AROUND

As our responsibilities in Haiti continue to grow (8 Haiti trips already on the calendar for this year), God has already opened up the doors for me to speak at 8 youth camps and conferences across the US in 2011. Add to that trips to South Africa, East Africa and Asia, and this year is shaping up to be even more full than last. Pray for God's sustaining power!
