A Vision Realized

"See, I have set before you an open door which no man can shut." Revelation 3:8

When I made my first trip to Open Door in the village of Bois De Lance, Haiti in 2003, all that stood on the compound was an unfinished church building, the crumbling remains of an old school and a small hut. Pastor Wiljean Compere had a big vision though. God would give them land where they would build a school, a medical clinic, a seminary, a mission house, an orphanage and a trade school. In my mind, I thought he was just a dreamer. All this for a church that only collected \$20 a month in offerings? But I told Wiljean (half trying to convince myself) that I believed God could provide all this, and that I would pray with him that God would. After over 40 trips the past 9 years, we have seen God do just that. God is working miracles in Haiti, and He continues to open doors that no man can shut!



In April 2003, on my very first trip to Haiti, I met these precious 5 year olds. A lot has changed at Open Door over the years, including 14 year olds Marline and Tamara.



The Vision Grows

Over the next year, we are trusting God to provide for a second dormitory wing at our Children's Home, allowing us to care for 50 children. We are

also adding classrooms and offices to our school in Bois De Lance, building dormitory space for our SOYM program, and completing our church and school in Hinche. We hope to expand our Poultry Project with 6-8 more chicken coops as well as other strategic agriculture initiatives. The needs are great, but we are confident, knowing that God's vision never lacks His provision!

Partners in the Vision

In just the past week, we have received requests from 6 different churches or groups wanting to join us on a trip to Open Door in 2012. How exciting to see God answering Jesus' prayer from Matthew 9:37-38, "The harvest is great, but the workers are few. So pray to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest; ask Him to send more workers into His fields." Thanks for prayerfully considering the part that God wants you to play in the great harvest that awaits in Haiti!

Servants' Quarters Fellowship

13 church members from SQF in New Smyrna Beach, FL made a recent trip to Open Door, where they worked at the orphanage, helped with our child sponsorship program, assisted in the clinic, taught young leaders and built a chicken coop.

WORKING AT THE ORPHANAGE



We have 25 children waiting to move into their new home, Open Door Children's Home. SQF was helping to put the finishing touches on our building, with men from the team installing the electrical and women helping to paint. After traveling to Open Door on a vision trip in February, Pastor David Starkey enlisted the help of his church. They contributed \$20,000 to the project earlier this year and began making plans to come and help. The only thing keeping us from opening our doors for these precious children now is the \$12,500 wall around the compound that the government has informed us we must build.

MEETING THEIR SPONSOR CHILD



At a recent Child Sponsorship Sunday at Servants' Quarters, church members committed to sponsoring 34 children at Open Door School & Feeding Center. Many of these child sponsors made the trip to Open Door and had the opportunity to meet their sponsor children. What a joy to see how far their \$25 a month can go. Women on the team helped to take our updated sponsor child pictures for the 2011-2012 school year. Earlier this year, SQF hosted a food packing event with Feeding Children Everywhere where they packed 5000 meals to send to Open Door to help feed our school

children.

HELPING AT THE MEDICAL CLINIC



Dr. David McKenzie pulled over 250 teeth and filled another 100 over 3 1/2 days at the dental clinic he led at the Open Door Medical Center. Working from 8am until 9pm with the assistance of team member Brandy and Haitian interpreter Tiroro, Dr. Dave tirelessly served the people of Bois De Lance. The dental needs are great, and his vision is to get our dental clinic set up with the equipment it needs so that any visiting dentist will have everything they need in place to serve the people. Dr. Dave plans to return soon, bringing other dental professionals with him.

TRAINING YOUNG LEADERS



Each September, another class of SOYM launches, training promising young leaders with the character, principles and skills they needs to build lifechanging ministries across Haiti. Pastor David Starkey from Servants' Quarters helped train our young men in Christ's Strategy for Making Disciples. His church provided scholarship funds to help our students attend SOYM this year. The cost of the 4 month residential program is only \$500 per student. Construction on our SOYM dormitory will begin this fall, allowing us to expand our training to include more students.

BUILDING A CHICKEN COOP



SOF contributed the funds and sent the team to build the first of what we hope to be many chicken coops in our Open Door Poultry Project. While this first coop will be a broiler house, where 400 birds will be raised over 6-8 weeks to sell at the market, future coops will be for layers as well. \$6500 builds a coop and buys the initial birds and feed. Each coop will provide about \$500 of income per month for the ministry. In just 4 days the SQF crew was able to complete the entire project, developing a template for future teams to continue expanding this sustainability effort..
