

FULLY PRESENT #LIKEJESUS

What does it look like to be fully present? While on His way to Jerusalem for Passover week, Jesus encountered many people and ministered from a heart full of compassion.

The disciples don't want Jesus bothered with the children, but Jesus says, "Let the little children come to me."

The Rich Young Man, relying on his wealth (a sign of God's blessing... so he must be doing something right) and on his moral efforts, wanted to know if he had done enough to inherit eternal life. Jesus looked at him with love.

When Jesus learned of Lazarus' death and of how Lazarus' sisters, Mary and Martha, were overcome with grief, Jesus was deeply moved and visibly distressed. He burst into tears. Those looking on said, "See how much he loved Lazarus!" Blind Bartimaeus cried out, "Son of David, take pity on me."

Zacchaeus, a crooked, despised tax collector, was looked in the eyes by Jesus and told Jesus would be a guest at his house (a sign of honor). For Jesus, people were not a

distraction or an intrusion. He truly loved them. He was unselfish with His time and attention. Sometimes I struggle with that...
