

Maybe it began when God stirred my heart through the early days of the Promise Keeper's movement to build bridges with African American pastors and break through the racial, social and economic barriers I saw in my own heart and community. Or maybe the call began on a college summer tour with Athletes in Action throughout Central and Eastern Europe, bringing the Gospel to impoverished communist countries like Hungary, Romania and Yugoslavia.
