The Legacy of Billy Graham

This week, I've been reflecting on the impact of Billy Graham in my own life. I'm sure many across America and around the world are doing the same thing. While I had heard much about the world renowned evangelist growing up, it wasn't until I was a graduate student at Wheaton College that his life began to impact mine in much more significant ways.

The Graduate School at Wheaton College is housed in the Billy Graham Center. Billy met his wife, Ruth Bell, while they were students at Wheaton in the early Wheaton's Billy Graham 40's. Center also houses the Billy Graham Museum, which tells the history of evangelism in America and the global impact of Billy Graham's life and ministry. While I was a student. I walked through the museum almost every week. There was a brief 10 minute video on Billy Graham's life narrated by radio host Paul Harvey. I'd watch that movie and then sit in the silence of the small theatre...

"Someday you will read or hear that Billy Graham is dead. Don't you believe a word of it. I shall be more alive than I am now. I will just have changed my address. I will have gone into the presence of God."


THE MIRACLE OF AMSTERDAM 2000

Then when I learned that they would be limiting the participants from America and that they had an application process to attend, I figured I would never be accepted and never filled out the application. 75,000 applicants, and they were choosing 10,000 to attend. Why would they choose me? Thankfully, Jennifer believed God wanted me in Amsterdam, so unbeknownst to me, she filled out the application. Imagine my shock when she handed me my acceptance letter to participate in the conference! God indeed had a plan! Those 10 days in Amsterdam shaped the course of our life and ministry in ways we could never have imagined...

As I reflect back on all those hours I spent in the Billy Graham Museum as a student. know that it was there that God refined and confirmed His call on my life to evangelism and that trip, our family moved to missions.

AMSTERDAM, HAITI & KENYA

After meeting Pastor Wiljean in 2000, I made my first trip to **Haiti** to do a youth evangelism conference with him in 2003. Within a year, we would help Wiljean purchase land for a ministry center, which would house a church and school. By 2006, we had launched Open Door Haiti as a non-profit in the US. The ministry would continue to grow with a medical center, a ministry training center, and eventually an orphanage. One church would become two, and then three, and then four... and now twenty churches have been

planted, with new church plants popping up each year. And of course, our involvement would grow our family too, as we finally completed our adoption of Analise and Maggie in 2014!



I traveled to Kenya in 2004 to minister together with Pastor Mickey and Pastor Hammre. Т soon learned that is was training these young leaders were hungry for, so traveled back six months later to equip them with Sonlife's disciple-making training. After Kenya in 2005 to adopt Mary-Faith, who was three at the time. Living in Kenya would create ministry opportunities that would eventually lead me to serving as the East Africa Coordinator for J-Life Africa, multiplying our disciple-making training from Kenya into Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, Tanzania and Zanzibar.

Since 2000, I've made over 80 trips to Haiti and 30 to Africa, and now I'm privileged to lead Sonlife, whose disciple-making training is happening in over 100 countries around the globe!

Billy Graham and Amsterdam 2000 has shaped the course of our life, ministry, and family in immeasurable ways!
