Devastation in Haiti

Just before 5pm yesterday (Jan 12), an earthquake measuring 7.0 on the ricter scale rocked the impoverished carribbean nation of Haiti. With the epicenter located just 10 miles west of Port Au Prince, Haiti's capital and home of over 2 million people, the devastation is massive, the loss of life unimaginable.

OPEN DOOR CHURCH

Our friends and ministry partners in Haiti are situated on the northern coast in the city of Cap Haitien/Bois De Lance, approximately 100 miles north of the epicenter. Even there, the quake and its aftershocks were felt strongly (5.0). The devastation in Port Au Prince is horrific. With many government buildings, hospitals, schools and businesses crumbled, and communication systems down, the whole country is crippled. Food, fuel and medicne will be hard to come by. A supply truck from Port Au Prince that was scheduled to bring food to our school children and hospital patients this week will now not come.



How Can You Help?

We are coordinating efforts with Missionary Flights International and Kids Against Hunger, Pure Water For All, and WorldWide Village to bring boxes of dried foods, water treatment kits and relief supplies to our ministry partners in Cap Haitien.

Each box of food can feed 36 people for a week, and will cost us only \$50 to ship.

Our opportunities to meet the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of those suffering in Haiti will grow in the coming months. Many children will find themselves orphaned. Food and fuel shortages will cause people to resort to desperate measures. Pray that we are prepared to meet the growing need of both the displaced and impoverished in Cap Haitien.
