They will be moving to Kenya later this year to help run our East Africa training center and host visiting mission teams. But I was excited when we finally got on the plane. We were on our way.



What I was most excited about was meeting my new sisters, Edithe (7) and Edline (10). They are orphans that our family is adopting. My parents have told me about them and showed me pictures, but I could hardly wait to meet them myself.

Once we landed in Haiti and drove to Open Door, my Dad brought Edline and Edithe over to meet me. They were sooooooooo cute! Little Edithe grabbed my hand and wouldn't let go. Edline

seemed shy at first, but then once we got to know each other better, she was hilarious.

The girls were able to do a sleepover with me two nights at the ministry house. Even though they know almost no english and I know almost no creole, we learned to communicate pretty well with simple words and hand motions. Edithe is so cute, always making funny faces and doing her signature move when music is playing, the air guitar.



Open Door has improved so much since I was there four years ago. The ministry house has a second floor. it's really nice. The school and the clinic have gotten bigger too. And of course the orphanage is so exciting. I can't wait for it to be finished. I want to go back when it is done and see all the kids that will get to live there.





Our team was busy working on the orphanage roof and building benches for the school. We girls found a room in the orphanage that became our "girls hangout" where we would sing and dance with the little girls when we were taking a break from working. I learned a lot of new songs and dances to teach my sisters and friends when I got home.



I was sad when my trip was over. Edithe and Edline were sad too. I wanted to put them in my suitcase and bring them home with me.
