A story from the pair who followed up Stephen* from the MAZE outreach:

He had been one of the participants in the show, and talked with us about that for awhile. When we brought up the spiritual stuff, he got much more serious as he shared that he'd thought about spiritual things a lot through most of his life, but had never talked to anyone about it. He's a genuine searcher, but felt quite alone in the search, and had never heard what Christians believed before (except for what's in tv shows and movies).

We asked if we could share the basics Christians believe, and went through the Knowing God Personally presentation of the gospel. He had a lot of questions, but was really focused and attentive the whole time. It was all new to him, but he was clearly very interested in continuing the conversation. When we explained that Cru was meant to be a context for students to talk about their spiritual lives, he expressed more interest. And lots more questions.

There are specific issues he's concerned about, but when I explained that the first thing I wanted him to consider was Jesus (the main beliefs of Christianity), I think he understood and agreed that core beliefs were a better way to determine if he wants to be a Christian than more tertiary doctrines... and took the booklet home to reread and think about the gospel more. Pray he'd believe it, and come to Cru to connect with other spiritually-minded students who can point him towards Christ.

Pray for us to have meaningful convos with students like Stephen who are searching and longing for spiritual truth but haven't known where to find it.
