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Dear «Greeting»,

Do you ever feel like there are times in your life when God uses different people and different passages in the Bible to get a message across to you? Lately I've gotten that feeling. It started one night a couple of weeks ago at dinner with a friend. Rachel and I first met when she came to Wildwood as a student in 2003 and our friendship deepened when she returned the following summer to help us lead the project as a "student staff."

During dinner after I had shared some of the challenges and things I am trusting God with, Rachel said something about how great it is that I am facing these new challenges. She asked me, "When was the last time you were really living outside your comfort zone?" She went on to encourage me reminding me of the benefit of such dependence to our walk with God.

A few days later I was reading in I Peter 1 about faith. This is what Peter says, "These trials will show that your faith is genuine. It is being tested as fire tests and purifies gold—though your faith is far more precious than mere gold. The message isn't just "live by faith," but that He loves me and He is doing a work in my life as I am living by faith. He is reminding me of the scene "above the scene" of my life. Even now as I think about that I am grateful for His love and care for me. I am also encouraged to persevere through the harder days; you know it isn't comfortable living outside of my "comfort zone." ⁽ⁱ⁾
