what He said, what He did, and what's the point of it. My hope is she will read this and have a greater understanding of the Bible. I'm also giving her, *Thinking About God an Introduction to Philosophy* that will help her to see it is reasonable to think God does exist.

It was great having time with our Epic (Asian American Ministry) summer mission during their orientation. I purposely went to experience a setting where white people were the minority as you can see in the picture below. In their first week they shared the gospel with many and 23 people prayed to receive Christ. Please pray that the seed will take root and bear fruit in their lives.
