On our first day, the group of 7 I was with divided into 2 groups made up of Americans and Filipinos. The Filipino students initiated sharing the gospel with fellow students. 10 people indicated they prayed to receive Christ with us that day.

It was interesting to listen as they shared the gospel in English and Tagalog, seamlessly switching between languages in the same sentence.
