In addition to fasting, praise, repentance, and prayers for the world, they prayed specific requests. Here are some of those:

- A - that God continues to heal her emotional scars and show that He will never abandon or abuse her
- Pray for revival on this campus that God would work in miraculous ways in the hearts and lives on this campus
- Temptations to sin and dishonor God - May God strengthen us so that when we are tempted, we will not give in to temptation
- For the disciples and disciple makers at UConn, that they take up their cross daily and place their burdens on the Lord, utterly dependent on Him for rest
- For those early in their walks with Christ. May the Lord grant them spiritual endurance and community as they navigate with Him through life
- For the unbelieving family members of believers. Matthew 5:16; that they may see the good works of the believers, recognize the aroma of the Lord, and glorify God because of it.
- Pray for I and D - that they may have the desire to read the Bible and get to know Jesus.
- S - recently diagnosed with critical arthritis and is getting treatment soon, pray that she recognizes God in her suffering and clings to Him for hope
- For courage in the hearts of believers to share the Gospel boldly in all of their relational networks
- K - that she may recognize the comfort that only Jesus can provide and that His love is everlasting no matter the sin. That Jesus doesn't operate in human judgement but only with radical, endless love.
- That those who have strayed from Christ be lead back to Him, that they remember who He is and never stray too far from His light
- That the members of Delta Tau Delta fraternity feel the love of Christ and come to him for comfort instead of the things of this world
- R - that he realize that money always dries up, but God never dries up
- That I might be successful in leading a Bible study tomorrow for the first time and we might uncover God's truth through his grace
