Dimya went into the evangelism conversation telling Erin, our staff, she “just wanted to watch, I don’t want to say anything”, but ended with sharing part of her own story of coming to faith in Jesus with a Hindu student who was super hungry to know about Jesus.

It was this year, in her theology class at a Catholic college, that Roshni, a sophomore Hindu student, had EVER heard anything about Jesus. She grew up in America, having never heard about what Jesus has done for her. Erin and Dimya were able to share the full gospel story with Roshni. She’s not yet ready to put her faith in Him.
