# A Day in the Life...

We have lived in Quito for 17 years now! When we first arrived we had no children and did not know how long we would be here. Now it is hard to imagine being anywhere else. Our ministry continues to change throughout the years and so does our daily routine.

So, we would like to take you through a typical day of ours. You can see the things that are similar to your day and things that are different.

#### 5:15 AM

3 times a week Geoff goes for a morning run with his friend Ralph. The air is always cool before sun-up and there is very little traffic on the streets. Just watch out for the stray dogs!

#### 6:00 AM

The sun is **rising**. The city buses begin their routes and the streets fill up with traffic and people walking. We get up, take showers and get ready for school and work.

We walk down to school and work, which are 11 blocks down the hill. Our work day is in Spanish.

#### 13:00 (1:00 PM)

Ecuadorians use 24 hour time in writing and 13:00 or 1:00 PM is **lunch** time. We often sit outside and eat our lunch under the palm trees. A typical lunch in Ecuador is soup, rice, beans, a vegetable with either beef or chicken.

#### 15:30 (3:30PM)

School is out for the day. Tammy and the kids walk home, back up those 11 blocks. It is good exercise and fortunately there is never snow!

#### 17:00 (5:00 PM)

This is the normal time to head **home** from the office. We eat dinner together as a family. In the evening we continue to work on e-mail and help the kids with homework, do projects, etc. By 7:00 PM it is always dark. The evenings tend to be chilly here in Quito but a sweater or blanket will keep out the chill.
