Groundbreaking

On November 30, 2021, we held a groundbreaking ceremony for the new building project. HCJB needs to move off our current location in Quito, where we have been for almost 80 years, and build a new office and studio building. The project is daunting, and something none of us has done before.

Now we are waiting for final approvals from the city to get the project started. Geoff has been involved in figuring out cabling needs for studios and our server rooms, and a little bit with the acoustical engineer too. Our hope is that the project will be finished in mid-2023. We have had a few delays, the latest being a partial redesign because the price of building materials went up sharply.
