He told me about this well dressed quirky humored Asian American guy named "Tu" (pronounced like the number 2). Blake had met Tu last school year in one of his classes where they started to become friends and then hung out all summer break. Tu had noticed that Blake was pretty involved with a lot of Christian stuff and wanted to know more about Christianity and why he believed what he did. So, last summer while they were hiking, Tu asked Blake all about Christianity and what it meant to him. The rest of the hike and for several hang times later Tu kept asking questions. As this school year starts, Tu started going to our Slo Crusade weekly meetings, and Epic's weekly meeting (Slo Crusade's Asian American meeting), and he even checked out local churches. This is about the time when I met Tu; I asked him what he believed, he said, "I grew up in a Buddhist home" and his parents encouraged him to check out all sorts of religions and was excited for

him to check out Christianity.

Since Tu was going to every Campus Crusade thing he also went to our weekend fall retreat get away. It was there that things really started to make sense for him. Tu connected to the speaker and he was able to get real open and honest with other men. At the retreat I give him a book, "More than a Carpenter" written by Josh McDowell, who became a Christian by trying to disprove it. As soon as Tu got home he started digging into the book and it was able to tie up a few loose ends for him. Thursday at 1:30am that week he finished the book and all his major doubts had been answered and Tu realized there are too many facts not to believe Jesus and that He really is who He claimed to be. So, Tu knelt down and asked Jesus to come into his life. He then texted Blake and all his close Cuesta Slo Crusade friends at 1:30am in the morning letting them know. **Last time I saw Tu he came up to me very serious and said, "Blake saved my life, no really he saved my life."** This was only a few weeks ago, since then Tu has been giving the "More than a Carpenter" book out to all his non-Christian friends. Any of his friends that start giving Tu a hard time he confidently says, "If you want to sit down and talk I'll tell you why I logically believe what I believe." Also, last Thursday at our weekly sharing time on the Cuesta Campus, Tu joined us and he loved talking to a self-proclaimed atheist. Tu told the atheist with a smile, "I know exactly where you are at, I believed all that just a few weeks ago, this is what helped me...". It has been so encouraging seeing this extreme life change in the past few weeks, but to be honest this is just one of many stories I could tell. God is moving here and we feel so blessed to be a part of it.
