Harvey Relief Work

This spring break Cru Buffalo sent 2 teams of students to Panama City to engaged other students with the Gospel. We also send 2 teams down to Houston to do Harvey Relief work. I (Kevin) had the privilege to lead 11 Daemen students down to Houston. For me it was quite the adventure being the only one that could legally drive the 3000 miles down and back by myself, and then slept in a small tent with 2 students on both sides of me that week. We joined up with a ministry called "Eight Days of Hope". It was super interesting to see how they organized, fed, and housed over

4000 volunteers to rebuild over 700 houses. **Our team did everything from dry walling, demolition, and roofing. Thats right, I can reroof your house now. Haha!** One of my hopes for the trip was for our students to truly bond with each other. Each campus we work at seems to have a big issue that keeps them from following the Lord well. Daemen students is studying. They don't even have typical college parties because they are all studying. You might be thinking how can this be bad, but having a relationship with Jesus and true authentic human connections is lacking there. We see the effects in the increasing depression rates. So to see our students deeply connect with each other was such a win!
