I had been a little bummed that no one was with me to help run the booth but it was exciting to a part of this unique God moment.

Prayer Request: One reality that has become apparent is that the nature of community college students is that students don't stay around very long. At our last leaders' meeting, by a show of hands we realized that about half of our main people involved in Cuesta Crusade are leaving next year.
