
The airfare for this trip to Korea will cost me in the neighborhood of \$1,100.

In November, my wife and I have been invited by GIBM Missionary Bob Martin to teach in the last module of a training institute. At the end of this module, we will participate in the graduation ceremony for the national pastors who finish their courses.

The airfare for this trip will cost about \$1,100 for the *both* of us.

In addition to these trips, I have been invited to make a journey to Sri Lanka to encourage the missionaries and national pastors. It is our hope to be able to bring home a video report and some statistics to aid those who may be praying about going to the mission field. We do not have dates or expenses calculated for this trip yet. The truth is that we need some help to be able to respond to the invitations which we have received. We are praying that the Lord will provide funds so that we may continue helping missionaries by visiting them on the field.

I have been a church planter and a pastor for over 30 years. My goal is the furtherance of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. As I often say while preaching, *"I want to finish my journey doing something that requires faith."* This can only be accomplished through prayer and our confidence in the Lord's provision. Please pray for us and consider using us in a missions conference or other meeting as the Lord directs your heart.
