The church here is beginning to prosper after the downturn from covid and the retirement of their beloved pastor and his wife. We are having visitors nearly every Sunday Morning at the 10 am service. One Sunday there were 13 visitors and seven of them were first timers. We did have a closing on the property. The fees have all been paid and the deed is in the possession of the church.

Since our last letter the Lord has allowed me to lead two adults and one teenager to faith in Jesus. In addition, Dan Pare, who is the song leader at Blackstone Valley Baptist Church, in Cumberland, RI, witnessed to one of his employees and led him to Christ just a few days ago. That employee lives very near to this church in Tiverton, RI. He has already visited one of the services and is planning to come again.



Please pray for John Mellos and his wife, Joey. I baptized them in the ocean last summer. He needs a heart transplant. His condition is worsening with time. He has been on the waiting list for a long time. They are both young in the Lord, but cheerfully engaged with the church. We have a ministry of providing protein drinks for John, which gives us an opportunity to visit them on a regular basis. It is such an encouragement when we do. We have other church members ministering to the Mellos as well. Mrs. Mello recently took a fall in the parking lot at work and has been out of work for some time.



<u>Last year's DVBS</u>. It was a good success. The church has grown some and the expectations are great. Pray with us for another Bible School that will honor the Lord and reach children with the gospel. It has become all too obvious that children must be reached if the churches are to carry on into the next generation. The devil is doing everything he can to keep them out of church and bound for hell.



The trip not taken. You will remember that my wife and I had plans to go to Seoul, South Korea last year. Three attempts were made to accommodate the invitation from **Missionary Benjamin Park** to no avail. It was mostly covid related complications. Brother Park wrote this note a few weeks ago. We are inclined to try again to go and help in the work as per his request. QUOTE, Benjamin Park: "I've read your letters and praised the Lord for His blessings upon North Tiverton Baptist Church. As I was praying and planning works in 2023, I've tried to find a slot to have our postponed Fundamental Baptist Conference in the coming springtime, but I could not find a suitable time. I have not invited any other speaker to this year's conference either. I wanted to have one with you before I have another speaker. We have had to postpone it a few times thanks to COVID 19. I was not comfortable inviting anyone else yet. So, would you like to try again to come over to S. Korea for the conference in September 2023. If you'd like to try again, we will stick with the plan we had last year."

Dear Dr. Parker,

We are providing with this letter a report of your support to the Lewis Team for the Calendar year 2023.

It is certainly our privilege to be helping a church which has historical roots that reach back more than one hundred years. The former pastor and our dear friend, Michael Hamilton is responsible for rejuvenating the work. I preached at his ordination service 25 + years ago. At that time, he was a member of Calvary Baptist Church in Middletown, RI. Brother Hamilton started as a church planter, and was invited to merge his church with this church several years ago. He had a good ministry here. When he came to the church he regrouped the members, redefined the doctrines, and updated the church by-laws. He did a thorough job and baptized numerous believers over the years. He is the reason the church is an independent Baptist Church today. The church building was old with no parking at all. They sold it and purchased a newer one that a Primitive Methodist Organization was in control of. The revitalized congregation paid the building off right after the covid disaster. Brother Hamilton and His wife both have health issues and they have retired to the South where they have relatives. He is still active in ministry, but not pastoring.

I said all of that to say this is the first church that the Lord has allowed my wife and I to help that has no unpleasant baggage to handle. It is also a privilege to minister in an area with where much of the history of Baptist people was written. Names like John Clarke, Roger Williams, Obadiah Holmes, and Ann Hutchinson made history for the Lord in this part of the country. In fact, religious freedom was born of their labors in the 1600's right in this neighborhood. Not ten minutes from where we live is Founder's Brook Park where they came after being flogged in Boston for refusing to agree with unbiblical doctrines of the state church such as infant baptism. The old Stone (Baptist) Church in Tiverton is around three hundred years old. When it started, I 'm told that it was illegal to baptize believers by immersion.

The church is thankful that we are with them. We receive a housing allowance from them, but your support is what put food on our table and gasoline in our car. Thank you for it! We are seeing progress in the lives of the people each week and the Lord is sending visitors to the services regularly. We are doing what we can with the resources that we have to let the Light of the Gospel shine from this historic and beautiful place for the glory of God.

The Lord continues to bless the work here in Rhode Island. I remind you that this is the state from which all our religious freedoms and evangelistic efforts in the USA originated. Names like John Clarke, Obadiah Holmes, Roger Williams, Ezekiel Holliman, and numerous others made the history of this small independent state. Those early founders, who were faithful to the Word of God, have passed from the scene. Most of their history is forgotten, but there is a remnant that remembers. We have much for which to be thankful. On May 4th, 1776, Rhode Island became the first American colony to renounce allegiance to King George III. It was the last state to ratify the United States Constitution on May 29th, 1790. Much of the language of the US Constitution was already provided in the Declaration of Independence of the colony of Rhode Island before July 4th, 1776.



The attendance here at North Tiverton Baptist Church has stabilized, and more volunteers are stepping up to the plate for service. We are thankful for this. We have added three to the church family by baptism since our last letter. We believe it is the beginning of a revival in our community. Most of the churches are woke, dead, or dying. There are far too few preachers coming to the Northeast. April 14th, we celebrated the Anniversary of



the Church here. We had the former pastor, Mike Hamilton, and his wife, Maureen, come and participate in the celebration. They were used mightily of the Lord to preserve the doctrinal and spiritual integrity of this ministry for twenty-five years. Before they came, there were literally dozens of short-term preachers who never brought the church forward significantly.

Matthew 9:38 Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest. We are praying for laborers and ultimately a man of God that will take the ministry here to the next level. Please pray with us about this matter. If and when the Lord moves us along, we intend to place the church in the hands of a capable and experienced man of God who will have a steady hand for the storms ahead. There is a great need for church planters in New England, as well as opportunities for seasoned men to help hurting churches. We will be happy to provide more information on these matters to interested parties.

The missionary offerings of the church have also increased allowing for an expanded missionary footprint. Thank you for helping us by prayer and giving to re-plow these old, fertile fields for the gospel.

I have started a class on Tuesday evenings. We call it the "Pastor's Class". I have enjoyed being able to reach out to the church family with some historical and practical lessons. We are praying for revival here. It seems that the Lord is moving in that direction.

In addition to these developments, we are in the process of upgrading the facilities here. The list of maintenance needs seems to grow daily. Yesterday the hot water tank at the church went out.

It seems to me that our country is beginning to understand that blessings are not man-made. Perhaps, in time, more people will see that repentance and faith are the key ingredients to a blessed life. Happiness cannot be the goal of our existence. It is the by-product of loving God.

I am so grateful for the numerous friends and supporting churches that have been on board with us for so many years. Your faithfulness in supporting the Lewis Team has allowed us to go much further than we ever dreamed that we would be able to go. We have been "drafted" to several hurting churches. If we had to rely upon our own resources, we could not have helped them. I am sure that they would agree with me when I say, "Your help is a gift from the hand of the Lord."

For us, every chapter is more exciting and productive than the previous one.



It continues to be a joyful experience for my wife and me to invest in the ministry here in Rhode Island. Souls are being added to the family of God, and there are several people that we intend to baptize in the Spring. Two of the activities that are particularly special to us are the "Girls of Grace" class that my wife teaches from our home once a week for young girls. Along with the spiritual activity, we have also paid attention the church property. We have added a handicap ramp for easier access to the main entrance. We recently replaced one of the bulkheads that is an egress from the lower level of the building. The steps were rotten, and the doors were so rusted that they allowed water into the building during the rain and snow. We have upgraded the pulpit area of the platform, and we have started projecting many of the songs, sermons, and lessons for better viewing and participation. The parking lot was also resurfaced recently. We are praying the Lord will provide a large van or small bus for the ministry here.
