## Dear Friends,

Several months ago, GIBM Missionary Benjamin Park expressed a real desire to Pastor Webster and me to help the sixty pastors in the Seoul area to become acquainted with the men of the GIBF. Since the GIBM is always looking for opportunities to expand their influence for missionaries and church planters around the globe, we both eagerly responded to the invitation. On October 13, 2011, Pastor Webster and I flew to Seoul, South Korea, for an eventful visit with the Korea Bible Baptist Preacher's Fellowship. This fellowship has the same doctrines, roots, and goals as the GIBF. We feel like this meeting was very timely. It appears that there are many things that we have in common with these Korean Christians. They treated us like foreign dignitaries every step of the way.

All of the pastors and missionaries that we met in Korea on this trip were open to interaction and hungry for participation with others of like precious faith.





Pastor Webster and I both preached at the meeting. He was featured each night, and the Lord blessed the meeting as he spoke on the church, baptism, the Lord's table, and related topics. All of the preaching and teaching was interpreted into the Korean language as it was being delivered.

It is our sincere desire to build bridges with pastors and fellowship groups around the world to enhance the efforts of global evangelism and church planting. In fact, by the time you receive this letter, my wife and I will be in Costa Rica with GIBM missionary, Bob Martin and his wife. I will have the privilege of teaching on the subject of the church in the final module of this season's institute for national pastors. I will also preach at the graduation ceremony.

On a personal note, my health has continued to improve over the summer. I have enjoyed a significant amount of weight loss since January 1st. This has been a real answer to prayer for me personally. I am no longer having severe joint pain and my blood pressure was down to 128 the last time I went to the doctor. Praise the Lord!
