# STUDENTS USE SOULARIUM TO ENGAGE THEIR PEERS IN SPIRITUAL CONVERSATIONS

This month Plymouth State
University held an "activities fair" to
welcome students back to campus.
The University expressed the desire
for all student groups to try to make
their booth more interactive. Our
Cru students were up for the
challenge! They decided to use an
evangelistic tool called Soularium to
engage their peers in spiritual
conversations. Soularium is a
picture survey in which our leaders
spread 50 cards with photographic

images all over a table and then asked students questions that would be answered by choosing a picture. Some of the questions were, "Which three images would you choose to describe your life right now?" and "Which image would you use to describe God?" Once a picture was chosen a follow up questions would be asked like, "Why? What does it say about God to you?"

PSU students from all spiritual backgrounds were fascinated by the

cards. Our students had the chance to dig into the lives of their peers and really listen to them, learning about who they are, what they believe and how to help build bridges from there to the gospel. The question, "When you think about your own spiritual journey, which image best represents what you wish were true?" was a perfect lead in for our students to share their testimonies and to invite their peers to investigate Jesus and to come to Cru events.
