# God under examination

"A loving God would not allow Hell"

Tim Keller puts it well, "hell is simply one's freely chosen identity apart from God on a trajectory into infinity....All God does in the end with people is give them what they most want, including freedom from himself."

C.S.Lewis explains, "There are two kinds of people - those who say 'Thy will be done' to God or those to whom God in the end says, 'Thy will be done.' All that are in Hell choose it. Without that self-choice it wouldn't be Hell."
