Trainees participated in over 20 experiential learning activities designed to teach norms, asking good questions, group management, communication, conflict resolution, creating a safe environment, program planning and other nuances of facilitation. They also designed their own programs to teach Biblical concepts like worthiness, judgment, and grace and truth experientially.

## What impact did it have?

We were pleased by the rave reviews. Even our Lifelines staff, who have many of these skills, said "This was a deeper version of Lifelines than what I've experienced in the past," and "There is a lot that applies to more than just the Lifelines context; I feel like I have life skills." Kurt, who works with internationals, learned "It takes courage to help people engage the heart." Please pray that the skills these leaders acquired would have a far reaching impact as they lead groups into relationship with Christ and into a deeper application of the Word.

### Who was it for?

Lifelines' first Facilitator School took place Feb 1-7. Eighteen people attended, comprised of Lifelines staff, church leaders, Cru high school staff, Valor ministry staff, campus ministry leaders, and a handful of people from Crusade's headquarters in Orlando. Our hope was to make it applicable for anyone who leads groups. One staff from the Research and Development team at Cru's National Office, confirmed that he learned "so many personal things, as well as things that will help me professionally."

## What was the purpose?

The Facilitator School was designed to equip Lifelines and other ministry leaders in the art and science of facilitating groups for believers, non-believers, peers, etc, with an emphasis on using experiential learning in Bible teaching.
