

Why do we do outdoor ministry? Reason #1 because Jesus did.

We know that 50% of Jesus's teaching was done in the outdoors! Why did Jesus spend so much time teaching in creation? You might just say, "that was the time period, Dan." But I believe there is a lot more to it than that. Jerusalem was a city of almost 300,000 people yet Jesus often went into the wilderness to connect with God and teach his disciples.

We see Jesus using illustrations from creation all the time. He points to the lilies of the field and birds of the air as he teaches about worry. Creation was His classroom for teaching spiritual truths.

As Lifelines, we try to model this style of

teaching. How can we point to creation to make our points? What are the benefits of teaching outdoors?

Creation is our co-witness! In Psalm 19 it says, "The heavens **declare** the glory of God; the skies **proclaim** the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth **speech**; night after night they display **knowledge.**" From my own experience I have seen that it is a lot easier for students to say there is no God while playing video games in their dorm rooms. However, most will admit that their arguments fall flat on top of a mountain looking at creation.
