

Already the Dads had partnered off with their kids answering spiritual questions intended to guide them into deeper conversation. After drilling their own holes, they gathered up to discuss ways to create meaningful moments, and together addressed how to pursue relationship. "We really appreciate today; you got me thinking about a goal list for my family," said one father. What a gift for a dad to give his kids: time and spiritual direction.

These were some of our discussion questions with the youth at our church last month when we hosted a Thrive program. The kids had just played a game of "Extreme Sorry!"—an activity we made up where the kids were the

pawns playing against each other on a massive game board. They could bump each other, build walls, and go forward or backward depending on cards drawn and the scheming of their team. It produced the intended result: the need to forgive those who were "undeserving." Although the game was lighthearted, real wounds are not. Kids talked about pain and practiced forgiving those who have hurt them, just as Christ has forgiven us.
