We never saw the water spouts that were promised, but as the weather cleared and we paddled on we enjoyed scores of dolphins, sea turtles, alligators, and a shark. What's more, we discovered a route that looks ideal for student groups. God also led us to perfect housing for beach evangelism near Miami. Dan and I left eager to return with students (especially when we drove back to snow!) Our hope is to take groups from the northeast to the Everglades for some spiritual and character growth and evangelism this coming winter. God instilled this idea and he guided our steps while there; we pray he will draw believers and non-believers to himself through this adventure in the years to come.
