This October our family began foster care for a pair of siblings. They came to us having been taken straight from their mom and they entered our house like feral cats. For the past three months they have dominated our lives. Joseph and Anastacia demanded our attention and if they did not get it, they were sure to destroy something. Homeschooling was scaled back to the bare minimum and done in shifts so an older child could always have an eye out. Our own kids were periodically shuttled to grandparents for a weekend reprieve only to return with dread and tears. It was apparent that despite the growth we were seeing in the foster children, our family was suffering; we had met our limits. I was consumed with guilt over the decision to have the kids moved to a new home. Weren't we called to this, Lord? Is this a sacrifice I should make? Who will care for them? Yet in his goodness, the Lord provided a new family for Joseph and Anastacia, and perhaps our purpose was to see them through the holidays; from Halloween, to Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Year's, birthdays... we had so much time to share God's love. Both kids prayed to receive Christ this month, and begged us to read the Bible we gave them. God alone can change the hearts and behavior of these small ones; he can heal their wounds. Please pray that he will.

For our family's unity, comfort and peace as we will attend three conferences in February


We met our support goal for January! Please pray for the next \$400 by the end of February.

With our move to New Hampshire, our scope moved from a single campus to an entire region. Now not only do we work with students at Plymouth State University (where the group has grown from 3 students last year to twenty students this year!); but we also serve campuses and other Cru staff teams from Maine to New York. In addition, Dan serves as the Human Resources Director for Lifelines nationally and both he and I are on the Advisory Council for Lifelines, which is a team that sets direction for the ministry – evaluating Lifelines’ effectiveness and seeking the Lord’s course for the future. Recently Dan has been reading a book about how Jesus used the outdoors to get to the disciples’ deepest doubts and beliefs.
