As we talked he shared with me how accepted he felt that weekend by the students involved with CRU.

Late into the night on Saturday three CRU students were talking with Isaac about how Jesus freely accepts all who come to Him. With a genuine heart Isaac asked Jesus to come into his life. Isaac is now meeting with an upperclassman to talk more about what it means to follow Christ.

Let's thank God together that He is in control and that Isaac is now beginning to experience an eternal relationship with Jesus.
