It seemed to go well, but he was aware that most people won't implement what they learn in a group setting until they see an actual conversation in action. So he invited some students to pair up with him for some spiritual conversations in the student union.

Last Wednesday, Adam joined Zac and they struck up a conversation with "Tim" using the Soularium tool, a packet full of creative photographs designed to help people express their spiritual thoughts. Zac could quickly see this student had spiritual interest, so he shared the Knowing God Personally booklet, which outlines God's plan of salvation. Tim ended up praying to receive Christ. Zac has since met with Tim, and is planning to meet again to help Tim grow in his faith.

The following day, Zac took another student out to model having a spiritual conversation when he came across "Arnold" he was aware had a distant faith at best. Following another good conversation, Zac invited Arnold to get up 30 minutes earlier in the morning to read the Bible with him. From my experience with university students, this is no small matter. So I was surprised when Zac told me yesterday they had already met twice to read scripture together at 7:20 a.m..
