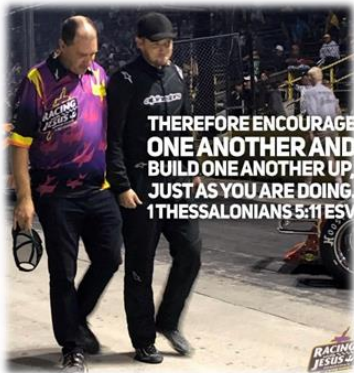




Greetings from your friends at Racing with Jesus Ministries. We have weathered the storm, made adjustments and adapted to the "new norm". Thank you for your continued support.

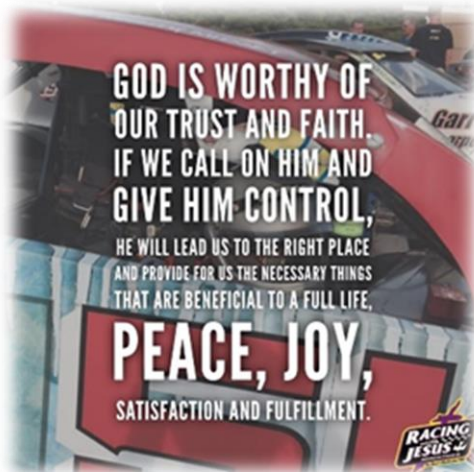
