Encounter Jesus

Every year over Christmas break life changing decisions are made at our annual Christmas conference, called Encounter. The Ehrman Project

One of the stronger voices speaking against the reliability of Scripture is that of Dr. Bart Ehrman who teaches right here at Chapel Hill. He is the head of the

religion department and author of several books. He teaches a class on the New Testament, which many students we know have taken. His arguments are gaining traction across the country and cause many students to deeply wrestle with his claims that the Bible can't be trusted. He has an enormous amount of influence, especially at UNC. Our director Miles O'Neill spearheaded a project 2 years ago to create a website where views supporting the authority of Scripture could be presented. On the site, there are responses from numerous theologians to many of the questions he raises. Our prayer is that this website would promote an ongoing conversation that would shape students' worldview and allow them to see the truths about Scripture and Jesus.
