The weather is just beginning to offer signs that the fall has arrived in Chapel Hill. And that means that another school year is in full swing! Erin and I can too easily forget the significance of this time of year in the midst of the busyness that accompanies it. These first few weeks of the semester are so crucial in students' lives, especially freshmen who are beginning to decide what they will spend their college years pursuing. Here is a brief overview of some of our beginning of the year events:

Leadership Training: A week before school started 95 student leaders joined our staff team in Wilmington, NC, for training and planning for the fall. Bible Study and Servant Team leaders had 3 days of connecting, hearing vision for the year, praying and being trained for their roles back on campus.

Freshman Picnic: Nearly 800 students came out to our Freshman Picnic the day before classes started! In an effort to introduce ourselves to as many new freshmen as possible, we served 1280 slices of pizza and 300 sub sandwiches to the masses. Freshmen heard more about who we are as a ministry and were able to meet the Bible study leaders in their area and begin to get plugged in.

Hoe Down: Our annual Hoe Down event offered a fun, friendly environment on the first weekend for people to

connect, eat great food, and learn how to swing dance. With an official square-dance caller and 250 pounds of BBQ pork, students got to enjoy a great evening together.

Weekly Meeting: The first three weeks of our weekly meeting we have averaged over 600 people in attendance. One of our staff is doing a series of talks called "The Greatest Story Ever Told" which will give an overview of the Bible.


Spiritually, Sweden is dead. The receptivity to the gospel is apathetic due to the perception that there is very little need for anything. Being a socialist nation where there are very little physical needs, there is little to no awareness to the spiritual needs that exist. It is very agnostic naturalistic society.

Ehrman Debate

On October 7 a debate will be taking place on campus here at UNC. Dinesh D'Souza will be debating one of UNC's own professors, Dr. Bart Ehrman, in a debate discussing the problem of suffering and evil. Dinesh D'Souza is a best-selling American author and speaker who has become a front line defender of Christianity. D'Souza is an accomplished debater and former policy analyst in the Reagan

administration. His most recent publication, What's So Great about Christianity, is a defense of the Christian faith.

Bart Ehrman, a best-selling author, holds a Ph.D. from Princeton Theological Seminary and is perhaps most famous for his



contribution to the study of the "historical Jesus." In many of his best-selling books, Ehrman challenges traditional Christian beliefs about the divinity of Christ, the resurrection, and other aspects of Christian faith. He recently wrote the book *God's Problem*, addressing the Bible's views on the problem of suffering.

We will be unveiling a website Oct. 7 with videos and articles to help communicate alternative views from scholars that oppose Ehrman's. The website is still being built, but you can check it out. **theehrmanproject.com**
