BACK IN MANHATTAN. KS

It has been an arduous journey this summer from July to what is difficult to realize is now September. Lots of traveling, transition, new relationships, and grace to keep me sane. I have spent the last 3 months in consistent motion connecting with friends and family, being at conferences, and have still yet to

settle completely. It's a season of life I'm ready to be done with, and a significant reason for my lack of correspondence throughout the summer.

Currently, I'm working in Manhattan, KS on the Kansas State campus with the staff team of 3 other men and 2 moms. I'm beginning to enjoy life again after the dust has settled from a myriad of tasks and relationships the first 2 weeks of the fall semester handed me.

We successfully distributed over 800 Freshman Survival Kits on the first 2 days of class and we are still initiating into the contacts we've obtained from that distribution process. Now we are trying to plug them into a place of fellowship if they desire to be involved.

Life is a process and I found that to re-enter a culture is not as simple as just stepping off an airplane.
