
- -Pray for our small groups to continue to cultivate outward influence and become great sources of life to those around them.

Dr. Peter Williams

Cambridge Professor Peter Williams stopped by UNC for an evening lecture September 24. He is a New Testament Professor has recently become more recognized in academia for his work in the historical reliability of Scriptures. While on a speaking circuit in the area he wanted to make it a point to be available. In light of his area of scholarship he wanted to share his thoughts before students that are hearing opposing views. The question and answer time was particularly helpful for many of the students taking Bart Ehrman's class. His presentation was insightful and encouraging to those seeking more thought on their convictions of God's Authority in scripture.





Peter J. Williams is the Warden (CEO) of Tyndale House and a member of the Faculty of Divinity in the University of Cambridge. He received his MA, MPhil and PhD, in the study of ancient languages related to the Bible from Cambridge University. In July 2007 he became the youngest Warden in the history of Tyndale House. He also holds his position as an honorary Senior Lecturer in Biblical Studies at the University of Aberdeen.
