In high school I lived like a chameleon, pretending to be the devout girl at church yet being outspokenly atheist everywhere else in my life. I was constantly searching for an identity through things I thought I could control like my appearance and friends. I had no intention of joining a campus ministry, going to church, or even THINKING about God. It was truly by the grace of God that he placed me in a suite with two girls who went to the Cru pizza picnic which I begrudgingly went to because of FOMO (fear of missing out) and the allure of free food. It was here at UNC through Cru that I finally saw the complete picture of the Gospel; I saw it lived out. I have come to understand that my previous reasons for why God can't possibly be real are actually disproven by His very nature. God is good and He always has been, even when I hated him and defied Him."

This year within our movement at UNC, stories just like this are taking place in students' lives. What a gift to walk beside the 600 students involved with us and the thousands of others all over campus! Our prayer is that many others can be transformed by the beautiful message of the hope in knowing Jesus.
