The Maze @ UNC

Around 1050 students attended The Maze on Feb 2. The Maze shares the gospel in a really powerful and unique way through the story of Jim Munroe and the entertainment of illusions. Jim is a cancer survivor and was saved through a blood donor—another person's blood literally gave him a new life. The parallels to the gospel are really vivid through his story, which he wove in throughout the night. It was a really fun day on campus inviting students and watching Jim perform magic tricks all over campus from the pit to the football dining hall.

The evening was filled with really great illusions and mind bending tricks to push up against the common worldview that what we see is all that there is. What if there actually is purpose and intention behind what we see? 22 people indicated a decision to trust God or recommit to their faith and 16 wanted to follow up with someone to talk more. As well, nearly 300 signed up with Be The Match (a bone marrow registry) to

potentially get to donate to someone in need in the future. Thank you for praying for this event- praise God for the many students he brought there!
