Spring Break NYC 2013

What happens when you combine 39 UNC students and 5 staff to be a part of the ministry happening in New York for a week? Life change happens!

I (Josh) was able to head up our spring break trip in March and it was a great week with students. Each day we split up into groups and headed to campuses all over the city, where we initiated spiritual conversations with students (using tools such as Soularium, a picture survey). We also tried to connect with potential leaders who might be interested in leading a Cru movement at their school (many campuses don't have Christian ministries at all). During the week nearly all of our students got to share their faith, some for the first time in their lives. We initiated 350 conversations and shared the gospel 113 times!

He is around fifth percentile in height and weight, but is on the right growth chart now (no more "adjusted age!"). Doctors are still amazed at his progress! He is curious about EVERYTHING, loves making animal noises, watching trucks and building legos. Things he is learning how to cope with are the word "no" and separation anxiety!

Rooted

The first weekend of April I (Erin) got to attend the annual Women's Beach Retreat with 150 students and staff from UNC. This is always one of my favorite things we do as a ministry! Not only does it help girls across the movement

connect with each other, we are also able to tackle real issues that are especially pertinent to us as women. The theme this year was "Rooted" and centered around Jeremiah 17, which reminds us to be rooted in the Lord rather than ourselves and the things of this world.

Saturday morning we held breakout sessions (led by staff and seniors) to talk about issues such as sexual purity, having healthy relationships and struggles with body image. I was able to lead a session this year about



dealing with grief. Preparing that seminar was so good for me as I "revisited" the early days of Harrison's birth and thought about what God has taught me since. I was so grateful to have a chance to share part of my story with the girls, talk with them about the challenging things they have gone through and discuss what it looks like to walk deeply with Christ in the midst of those times. (Honestly, things I learned much later looking back on the NICU days!)

The last morning of the retreat we had a time of sharing- always a highlight for me! Two girls shared that they almost didn't come but that the weekend was very significant in moving them closer to beginning a relationship with Jesus. One girl shared about a recent breakup that had her reeling, as she had placed her identity in that relationship. During the weekend she understood the Gospel for



the first time and began a relationship with Christ-seeing Him as her sole identity! Another girl shared that she feared coming because it had been such a lonely year for her. During the weekend she was embraced by the Body of Christ and felt pursued and loved. Girls shared that the vulnerability modeled by the seniors and staff upfront helped them feel like they could be more honest about sin in their lives. "The issues

we talked about (body image, relationships, depression/anxiety) were real and present issues in most of our lives. It was refreshing to talk about these issues that sometimes so easily can get swept under the rug," said Hannah, a freshman. "I was so thankful for this because I realized EVERYONE has struggles, not just me." Praise the Lord for such a great retreat!
