Todd Williams (staff, Boston Metro Team) Todd spoke about how God is changing the lives of lost students on Boston campuses. One story involved Ed [not his real name], who realized at the Boston Winter Conference that his relationship with his non-christian girlfriend was unhealthy, and agreed to call her. Todd followed up with him a couple of weeks later and asked him how the conversation had gone. "I don't know. 'We talked, and I told her about what God was doing in my life, and she told me she wanted to know God too. So I told her how and she prayed to follow Christ. Is that ok?""
