Lizzie: "My experience at Hunter College was amazing! I initiated a conversation with Joleen, a pre-med student from Jamaica who didn't quite understand Christianity. Through Soularium, an evangelistic tool that effectively uses photographs to spark spiritual conversations, Joleen told my friend and I she wanted to believe in Jesus but wasn't sure how. We shared our own personal experiences with Joleen, and talked about the assurance of faith she has in Christ. Soularium easily transitioned into the four spiritual laws, and Joleen prayed to receive Christ! At that moment I think I finally understood

the importance of intentional evangelism."

Dani: "I went with Megan to Kingsborough Community College in Brooklyn, which has a small beach right outside of the cafeteria. We did Soularium with two of the lifeguards on duty and talked to them for a little bit. They weren't extremely interested in talking about Christ or the Gospel, but they encouraged their friend Chris to take the Soularium survey when he walked up. Megan started talking to him about God, church, religion, and Jesus, and they ended up moving a little farther away while I continued talking to the lifeguards. As we were walking away an hour later, Megan told me that Chris prayed to receive Christ. It was exciting for me to see how God used a conversation with the lifeguards to begin an important conversation with Chris that will hopefully change his life."

We set out for 3 days in New York City on June 30th, with the twin goals of 1) giving some Operational lift to the New York Metro team, and 2) giving our students some exposure and vision for ministry in 'The City'. I'm excited to report that both of those happened!
