As you may recall, I have been working with the leadership of Quisqueya Christian School in Port-au-Prince for several years now. And although the school has certainly gone through challenging times in the past, the struggles they face today are more challenging and disruptive than ever before.

As a nation, the country of Haiti has struggled for decades but add to the economic and cultural struggles the recent assassination of their President, the impact of another major earthquake, the Covid-19 pandemic, and the increase in organized gang activity and take-cover of many regions, which recently includes the kidnapping of many Christians, and their ability to positively move forward in the work of Christian Education is nothing short of Herculean. 
