



AIA Special Events: Imagine yourself in a room with 2,000+ people from different backgrounds- NFL players & coaches, football fans, business leaders, AIA staff, and more. It's the morning before the Super Bowl and you are all together anticipating the opportunity to hear from NFL legend, Bart Starr, and see him recognize an NFL player for exemplifying character in the home, on the field of competition, on their team, and in the community. This year's award winner was London Fletcher of the Washington Redskins. We had the opportunity to see God moving thru AIA's 25th annual Super Bowl Breakfast. There were many highlights of the event, especially NFL General Managers & players sharing how their relationship with Jesus has developed and how that has provided them with peace and joy they haven't been able to find anywhere else. The Holy Spirit was moving in people's hearts, impacting lives in ways we've prayed for! There were 57 people who indicated that they had trusted Jesus for the first time as their Savior when an invitation was shared; 340 others wanted to hear more information about what a relationship with God means, and 172 desired to be connected to a small group Bible study. Please pray for AIA as our staff follow-up with these people.



Another place we have seen God using sport for His glory was at the NBA All-Star Breakfast that Kyle got to help prepare for in his temporary role in our "Special Events Department". NBA great David Robinson was recognized for his legacy of faith and influence. As he received the award, Robinson shared "Records that you break, they will be passed. The people that you impact, that you touch, that will last for all eternity." As he shared about what a truly significant and meaningful life is, Robinson said "I had a lot when I came to the Lord, or at least I thought I did," Robinson described the athletic and financial success he experienced in the NBA. "I was winning the race, but it's the wrong race. I've run after my own joy, my own success, and it meant nothing." He encouraged the audience to pursue the peace that can only come from putting your trust in Jesus alone and invited them to begin a relationship with Christ.



Where is Meredith Now!?...Some of you may remember us sharing about Mer, one of our UNC student leaders who Jayne got to help disciple. We thought you might enjoy hearing how God is using her now that she has graduated!
