The air in the room is thick with tears and I can feel the Holy Spirit moving in unique ways. He is leading some to **give a year of their life to full-time ministry**. Some students are resolved to finally take a stand for Christ in their classes. Many notes that I read mentioned that they were committed to sharing the gospel with family members who don't know Christ. Just like the students, I'm wrestling with the reality that one day I will stand before Jesus and give an account for how I used my time, talents, and treasures.



It was the last night at the San Diego Winter Conference and earlier in the evening we had experienced an amazing play entitled "The Bema." The Bema is "a 90-minute one man play about the return of Christ and the Biblical truth of stewardship." This night was by far the most impacting upon myself. The art of theater, when done well, is one which envelopes you and drops you right in the middle of what is happening. It honestly felt as though we were getting a glimpse into what meeting Jesus would be like. It was beautiful, shocking, and revolutionary ALL IN ONE! I continue to pray that this night would rock us to the core and cause us to truly count all things lose compared to knowing Christ and making him known. Also, it caused me to seriously reconsider moving overseas long-term in the future.
