It felt like I was drinking from a fire hose last spring as I was taking the Perspectives missions course. One of my most frequent prayers through it was that God would open my eyes to ways I could personally be a better missionary to college students, and especially college athletes. Well, it definitely happened.

While reading the history of missions articles, one theme became quite clear to me. One mistake that western missionaries have made in the past is to extract the native who had just come to Christ and place them in a training school. After much time away from their family, community, or tribe, the native was no longer seen as a native, but shunned from their community. Thus, the multiplication of the gospel in that culture was very slow.

This wisdom has helped me to shape the way our ministry to student-athletes is moving. The bulk of my energy is spent pouring into those who want to be an "Ambassador" for Christ on their team. My prayer is for these student-athletes to multiply their faith where they already are - amongst their teammates! They spend hours at practice, in the locker rooms, and on the bus with them. They can relate better and share the gospel with their sport's vernacular. Pray we have the mindset of 2 Corinthians 5, that "God is making his appeal through us... be reconciled to God!"
