Our overall goal is to foster an environment filled with grace and truth so that students can experience the Lord through their relationships in a way that will bring lasting character change. Our value of intimacy with Jesus and others plays out in our experiences together.

Each week we were focusing on one area of growth and how they affect relationships. While backpacking we talked about the benefits of bonding authentically with others so we can experience God's grace through them. Day-hiking focused on establishing healthy boundaries such as knowing when to say "No" to people. Rock climbing helped students to learn how to identify and be comfortable with the good and bad in themselves and others. And lastly, it was so fun talking about adulthood while whitewater rafting! An issue that many students dealt with in this area is not comparing themselves.

God was very gracious in allowing us to ultimately realize that we need His Spirit to change us! *Please pray that we will continue to yield to the Holy Spirit as God leads us into understanding more about Him and ourselves.*
